

# From the Desk of the Director... 🖉

The ecosystem of Odisha cancer care has undergone a metamorphosis in the recent past. AHPGIC is playing the leading role in this transformation. On completion of the construction of the new LINAC building the bed strength of the Institute is enhanced from 281 to 507. Three new radiotherapy bunkers have been constructed. Two state of the art Linear Accelerators are installed. A new Brachy Therapy system strengthened the capability of intracavitary radiotherapy service. A PETCT scan installed on PPP mode to provide free service under NIDAN scheme. This is the first such an imaging unit under the State Government. The pathology & allied departments have also undergone a massive transformation. Tumor markers, IHC studies, Biochemical tests, Culture sensitivity added strength to the diagnostic services. Molecular studies have been initiated under Nidan scheme on PPP mode, the cost which is borne by the state government. With the appointment of a medical gastro-enterologist the endoscopy services are now handled by a high-quality professional. Dedicated Plastic & Reconstructive surgeon, Nuclear medicine specialist fulfilled the longstanding gaps in the service. One more operating room and a 20 bedded central ICU added to the infrastructure. An international service provider identified through a transparent method is providing comprehensive maintenance services (CFMS) to the entire Institute. This has changed the face of the center. MD in anesthesiology (two seats), MD in pathology (four seats) and diploma in radiotherapy technician (DRTT, 10 seats) started in the Institute. The Institute is under the process of full digitalization.

The future of AHPGIC looks very bright. Further expansion is linked with the SCB redevelopment plan. Under this, the bed strength will be enhanced to 1000 beds. 15 table modular OT complex, new OPD, Academic area, hostels have been incorporated in the plan. The master plan has been prepared by a reputed consultant and submitted to the government. The physical work is going the commence very soon.

Besides development of AHPGIC, under Odisha Comprehensive Cancer Plan (OCCP)1029 Cr is sanctioned for 11 cancer wings dispersed all over the state. This will improve the accessibility of cancer care for the entire population.

Cancer is going to be major health challenge in the future. Odisha government is committed to improve its infrastructure to meet the challenge.

I wish with commitment & dedication AHPGIC will emerge as a center of excellence soon.

# **REPORT OF THE DEAN AND PRINCIPAL**

Our Institute has been approved by the NMC / MCI as the first Post-graduate Medical College of our State, without MBBS course, from the academic year 2017-18. To start with the Post-graduate students have been admitted in 2017 Super specialty Courses i.e. **Surgical Oncology** and **Gynecological Oncology** and three batches of M.Ch students have passed out in 2020, 2021 and 2022. The fourth batch of M.Ch students have takenadmission in 2020.



# I. Super Specialty Courses :

- (a) 2 seats each in Surgical Oncology and Gynaecological Oncology were permitted in the academic year 2017,and 2 students in each subject were admitted. The course was recognised by NMC on 17.09.2020.
- (b) Six batches of students have taken admission since 2017 to 2022.
- (c) Three batches have passed out successfully.
- (d) Three batches are taking their teaching and training program at present as per the syllabus approved by Utkal University.

# II. Broad Specialty Courses :

- (a) This year we have been permitted to open 2 seats in MD Anaesthesiology and 2 students have taken admission (one student in All India Quota and one student in State Quota).
- (b) We have been permitted to open 04 seats in Pathology in Academic year 2023-24. Awaiting counselling and admission.
- (c) Ongoing PG course in MD Radiation Oncology is continuing 6 students have taken admission during the academic year 2021-2022 under the control of Dean & Principal, SCBMCH, Cuttack and pursing their study at AHPGIC, Cuttack.

# III. Diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology (DMLT) :

DMLT courses for 20 students was started during the academic year 2017-18 for a period of 2 years followed by internship of 3 months.

- 1<sup>st</sup> batch 2017-18
  - 19 students took admission and 18 have completed internship in March 2021.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> batch 2018-19
   19 students took admission. All passed out and completed internship.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> batch 2019-20
- 19 students took admission. All passed out and completed internship.
- 4<sup>th</sup> batch 2020-21 : 17 students took admission and are continuing their teaching program.
- 5<sup>th</sup> batch 2021-22 : 20 students took admission.
- 6<sup>th</sup> batch 2022-23 : 20 students have taken admission.

# IV. Certified OT Technician (COTT) Course :

COTT course started in the academic year 2020-2021 for 5 students for a period of 1 year.

1<sup>st</sup> batch, 4 students took admission and passed out in 2021.

2<sup>nd</sup> batch, 5 students took admission. They passed out in March 2023.

3<sup>rd</sup> batch, 3 students have taken admission in March 2023.

# V. DRTT course :

DRTT course opened for 10 students per year. 10 students have taken admission

### VI. M.Sc. in Medical Radiation Physics:

AHPGIC, Cuttack in collaboration with NISER, Khurda district, Odisha has started M.Sc. in Medical Radiation Physics, a 2 years course for 10 students. The 1<sup>st</sup> batch has taken admission in 2022-2023.

### VII. Research Activities:

Projects approved by IEC held on 10.01.2023. PG Thesis - 10 Research Project - 23. Students from other institutions do their dissertation for 6 months.

# AHPGIC AT A GLANCE

# **ACADEMICS & RESEARCH**

Acharya Harihar Post Graduate Institute of Cancer (AHPGIC), Cuttack is marching forward with its PG Courses, M.Ch. (Gynaecological Oncology), M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology), MD (Radiation Oncology), MD (Anaesthesiology), DMLT, DRTT and COTT courses to produce qualified human resources to serve the cancerpatient of our country and abroad. The Medical Physics course has been started at NISER, Khordha with our technical support from this year. A department of Pulmonary Medicine created. Clinical training for B.Sc. Nursing/Post Basic Nursing/M.Sc. Nursing students available.

Research is an integral segment of medical education and patient care. Institutional Ethics Committee (IEC-AHPGIC) of the centre conducts meetings at regular intervals for review and approval of new research work to be performed on recommendation of Institutional Review Board (IRB). Several Govt. and industry sponsored intra-mural and extra-mural research works are being conducted in the institution resulting in good amount of publications in premier journals of national and international repute.

Library Committee supervises the maintenance and development of AHPGIC central library and elibrary. Postgraduate committee monitors PG & M.Ch. education as well as inter departmental and inter institutional academic activities. Hostel Committee looks after the day to day affairs of both ladies and gents hostel for residential doctors.

Hospital Based Cancer Registry & Patterns of Care & Survival Studies in Cancer Cervix, Cancer Breast and Head & Neck Cancers (HBCR-POCSS) project under National Cancer Registry Programme is working in the centre. Similarly the centre is enrolled in National Cancer Grid network. The NCG was created to form a union of cancer centres in the country which could provide uniform and high standards of cancer care, follow uniform evidence based guidelines for management of patients, develop human resource adequately trained to fulfill the cancer healthcare needs of the entire nation and conduct a collaborative clinical research of high standard.

Tumor board and referral boards are conducted for discussion and decision of treatment protocols for patients consisting of specialists of each segment in regular interval.

AHPGIC undertakes trainings and courses for medical doctors, nurses, paramedical staff and students to build additional manpower in the field of oncology.

#### NIRAMAYA

The drug ware house is functioning for storing and management of Anticancer drugs for the whole state and NIRAMAYA is able to fulfill 100% demand for both general and anti cancer drugs.

#### Telemedicine

Telemedicine centre is a great help for cancer patients of different districts minimizing the long distance travel to the centre. This is also being utilized for tele-conferencing with premier institutes for academic discussions and meetings. This service became the best support for the patients during the lockdown due to Covid-19 pandemic outbreak. Now the e-sanjeevani application is being successfully implemented with the help of telemedicine infrastructure.

#### **Community Activity**

AHPGIC is actively engaged in the community service in the form of cancer education, consultation and early detection through camps and various media across the state. Social Workers-cum-counselors of different NGOs have been deployed for patient assistance.

#### Hospital Information Management System

O-eHMIS project of CDAC, NOIDA is under process of customization and testing for competition of Hospital information Management System at AHPGIC. Several modules are live and working successfully.

#### Infrastructure

A 6 storied structure over the existing LINAC completed, handed over & inaugurated. It provides necessary services like Radiodiagnosis, PETCT, ICU & IPD and the expansion of bed strength from 281 to 507 including a20 bedded ICU.

#### CFMS

One single agency is working for Comprehensive Facility Management for all Services covered under NIRMAL++.

#### PALLIATIVE MEDICINE

This unit provides prompt pain relief and palliative care through different modalities of services & immediate management of pain to patients at any stage of the disease (mostly terminally ill) with an intention for an improved quality of life. The services provided here have managed to garner recognition throughout different region which is reflected through the influx of patients from various government and private medical colleges & hospitals of eastern India.

IAPC certification courses are being conducted in 2 sessions in a year for all doctors, nurses, volunteers and social workers at the centre.

Our centre, being the State Nodal Centre for Palliative Care, coordinates with the 30 satellite centres established at district headquarter hospitals of the state, to offer Palliative treatment. There is a plan to strengthen this department by creating separate faculty post, thereby opening PG course in Palliative Medicine.

MOU with Bagchi-Karunashraya has been signed for home based palliative care free of cost in the state.

#### **GYNAECOLOGICAL ONCOLOGY**

Gynecological Oncology deals with female cancer patients for prevention, palliation, early diagnosis and prompt adequate treatment. Departmental library has more than 100 books and periodicals for education and research purpose. A state level training on Pap Smear screening was conducted by the Department in collaboration with Department of Pathology for O&G Specialists of different districts. State level project on HPV self-collection and treatment of screened positive cases are being done by the department. Department organizes the Cervical cancer eradication day on 11<sup>th</sup> March every year.

Two batches of three days State level training for O&G specialists of DHH on colposcopy, biopsy and thermocoagulation for screening of cervical cancer were undertaken. Public awareness programmes are being done with priority basis.

- o Diagnosis of premalignant lesions and its proper treatment
- Routine screening of female population for early diagnosis of cancer cervix amongst the patients attending the outdoor of the centre

# **HEAD & NECK ONCOLOGY**

Oral cancer is one of the 10 most common cancers of the world and the commonest in India. There is excellent evidence from many sources that approximately 90% of these cancers are due to tobacco abuse in any form and poor oral & dental hygiene. Almost 70% - 80% of the cases reported have advanced stage of cancer which is practically in Stage-III & IV. Cancers of the Thyroid gland, parotid gland and minor salivary glands are also frequently reported in this Dept. The incidence of pre-malignant lesions like leukoplakia and sub-mucous fibrosis has increased considerably. Cosmetic value being a vital factor, various reconstructive procedures is being performed by this department. The

post- graduate students, Paramedical staffs and exservice doctors are imparted regular training programs keeping in view the early detection, prevention and treatment of Head & Neck cancers as the main theme.

The main function of this division is to provide treatment care for the patients suffering from wide range of malignant neoplasms especially for hematological malignancies, lymphoma and solid neoplasms by chemotherapy as primary mode, concurrent mode (CT/RT), neo-adjuvant before RT/Surgery or adjuvant mode following RT/ Surgery.

The faculties of Medical Oncology teach & guide the Radio Therapy PG students on Chemotherapy.

The doctors and Paramedics of different districts are trained on Daycare Chemotherapy in regular interval under Dept. of Medical Oncology who renders service to follow up cancer patients in all DHHs of Odisha.

Department of Medical Oncology has a Pediatric Oncology Wing for pediatric patients coming to the centre. The ten bedded Sovan Bhuyan Memorial Day Care Unit is serving under the department for the patients receiving chemotherapy on day care basis.

# MEDICAL PHYSICS

The Department of Medical Physics ensures implementation of the provisions of the Radiation Protection Rules (RPR)-2004 enforced by the Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB), Government of India with the following responsibilities:

- Evaluation and optimization of Radiation treatment planning for cancer patients undergoing radiation therapy.
- Performing radiation dosimetry, periodic calibrations, quality assurance (QA) testing traceable to national standards laboratory and maintenance of all the radiotherapeutic and radiodiagnostic equipments / machines.
- Observing radiation safety for the radiation workers, staff members, patients and public in the Departments of Radiation Oncology, Radiodiagnosis, Nuclear Medicine and MedicalPhysics.
- o Participating in various research and developmental activities of the centre.
- Facility design and Planning for commissioning of new radiation installations and decommissioning of old installations in accordance with the requirements of the installation that meets the regulatory stipulations of radiation protection and safety.

- o Preparations of specifications for treatment and dosimetric equipmen
- o Measurement, analysis and tabulation of beam data for clinical use.
- Acceptance testing, commissioning and quality assurance (including calibration) of radiation facilities.
- Development of Q A protocols and procedures in radiation therapy regarding delivery of radiation treatment, radiation safety and control and regulatory supervision of radiation therapy equipment servicing and maintenance of records.
- Teaching Radiation Physics to the PG students for MD (Radiation Oncology) degree and the DMRT (Dip. in Medical Radiation Technology) students of SCB Medical College, Cuttack.

#### **RADIATION ONCOLOGY**

This department treats about 200 patients daily using telecobalt therapy and HDR brachytherapy. About 65% of all cancer patients attending this institute avail radiation therapy during their course of treatment. External Beam therapy is delivered by one telecobalt units (Theratron-780C) from 8:00 AM to late night in three shifts on all working days. Multiple-fields, wedge, block and tangential fields at 80cm SSD are practiced as required. Now the department is well equipped with Linear Accelerator and CT Simulator. More than thousand patients were treated successfully with most sophisticated treatment modalities like VMAT and IMRT. PG - studies in radiotherapy leading to MD (RT) is available in this institute since 1973. Six PG students take admission every year for their MD degree. Post graduate seminars are organized twice a month.

#### SURGICAL ONCOLOGY

Surgical oncology is one of the important departments of the cancer centre. Usually all the new patients coming to the center are first seen in the Surgical Oncology OPD and after getting the tissue or cytological diagnosis and evaluation for operability both clinically and radiologically, those patients are taken for surgical admission and operations. Inoperable cases detected either clinically or radiologically are referred for other modality of treatments like chemotherapy and or radiotherapy.

Modified radical mastectomy. Breast conservation surgeries, radical gastric resections, Abdomino Perineal Resection of rectal cancers are few of those surgeries being done routinely. Radical as well as conservative surgeries for cancer penis are also done frequently. Many a palliative and bypass surgeries are being times done to alleviate pain and agony, Oesophagogastrectomy, Whipples procedures are been done less frequently. Wide local excision of soft tissue cancers are also being done in routine basis along with reconstructive procedures.

Post -graduate students from the department of Surgery, SCB Medical College, Cuttack are undertaking training on rotation. Surgeons peripheral health from are services also undergoing re- orientation training in surgical departmental technique on rotation basis. The seminar is being conducted regularly. The also delivered many guest faculties have lecturers, presented papers in conferences and taken part in various symposia and workshops. Faculties regularly take part in early cancer detection and educational programs joining the cancer control camps and various awareness M.Ch. in programs. Surgical Oncology is continuing from 2017.

Two batches of three days State level training and one batch of one day training for Surgery specialists of DHH on screening of Breast cancer were undertaken.


#### AGE DISTRIBUTION OF OPD NEW PATIENTS 2022-23












#### AGE DISTRIBUTION OF IPD NEW PATIENTS 2022-23
